



Indexation / Adjustment for FY 2023-24 under MYT 2020-21 to 2024-25

Pay & Allowances:

Pay and Allowances, including employee's salaries and benefits, which are a major component of the O&M expenses of TESCO. TESCO comes under the umbrella of Ministry of Energy and has currently adopted the pay structure of BPS for its regular employees. Further any increase in salaries announced by the Federal Government is adopted by TESCO.

Federal Government vide O.M. has 2022-283 dated 1st July, 2022 has revised the pay scales of employees along with additional ad hoc relief allowance of 15% (Annexure-A1). Further 5% financial impact of annual increment, as already allowed by NEPRA, has to be considered for indexation/adjustment of pay and allowances for the FY 2023-24. The total cost under the head Pay & Allowances of the Supply business requested is Rs. 226.53 million for FY 2023-24, while for the Distribution business is Rs. 906.11 million for FY 2023-24, with total financial impact for Pay & Allowances of Rs. 1132.64 million is requested for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

Post-Retirement Benefits:

The post-retirement benefits of TESCO's employees is paid at the same rate as announced by Federal Government. Further the post-retirement benefits also increase with the retirement of new employees.

Federal Government vide O.M. 2022-486 dated 1st July, 2022 (Annexure-A2) has announced an increase of 15% in the pension of pensioners. The total cost under the head Post-Retirement Benefits for Supply business requested is Rs. 105.35 million for FY 2023-24 and Rs. 421.39 million is requested for Distribution business for FY 2023-24, with total financial impact of Post-Retirement Benefits of Rs. 526.73 million is requested for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

New Hiring:

In FY 2021-22 TESCO has hired Dy. Director Internal Audit and Dy. Director Legal as per the direction of the Board (Annexure-B1) of Directors of TESCO to streamline the internal audit issues and to address the increasing legal matters of TESCO on different issues. TESCO has severe shortage of assistant directors and many posts of assistant directors remained vacant. In order to achieve the smooth operations of TESCO both Suppliers and Distribution business, the ministry of energy power division has allowed the Board of Directors of TESCO for new recruitment both for officers and officials, as per the approved yard stick. Accordingly, the recruitment process through proper procedures has been started during FY 2021-22 that was partially completed and 14 officers have been hired (2 in FY 2021-22 and 12 in FY 2022-23) by TESCO. Further for FY 2023-24, 21 officers and 505 officials will be hired to fill the vacant posts of TESCO.

The financial impact of hiring made in FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 has been made part of PYA. The Salary structure of these officers will be lump sum based and independent of BPS pay scales. The total financial impact in PYA is for FY 2021-22 Rs. 0.21 million for Supply business and 0.82 million for Distribution business, while for FY 2022-23 the financial impact in PYA is Rs. 1.45 million of Supply business and Rs. 5.79 million for Distribution business. The total impact on PYA is Rs. 8.26 million.

While for the future hiring the total costs for New Hiring requested is Rs. 48.98 million for Supply business for FY 2023-24 and Rs. 195.91 million for Distribution business is requested for FY 2023-34. Total costs for new hiring of Rs. 244.88 million is requested for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment. (Annexure-B2.1) (Annexure-B2.2)

MIRAD Expenses:

NEPRA has approved detailed design and implementation plan of the Competitive Trading Bilateral Contract Market (CTBCM) on November 12, 2020, to make a competitive wholesale electricity market functional in near future. Pursuant thereto, TESCO have created a Market Implementation & Regulatory Affairs Department (MIRAD) which became operational from September 2021.

Regarding recruitment for MIRAD, the Authority has decided to allow hiring for MIRAD in principal and direction has been made to recruit the adequate staff, equipment, and vehicles for the MIRAD

department of TESCO. TESCO D.G. MIRAD was hired in September 2021 for proper operationalization along with adequate staff in MIRAD department.

The financial impact of hiring made in FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 has been made part of PYA. The Salary structure of the officers hired from the market is lump sum based and independent of BPS pay scales. The officers internally transferred from different departments of TESCO are also charged (Salary and Benefits) under MIRAD department and accordingly their salaries along with benefits are made part of MIRAD expenses. The MIRAD expenses includes the salary of the staff, purchase of equipment, purchase of furniture and fixtures, rents and utility bills, POL, software and vehicles. The total financial impact in PYA is for FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 Rs. 10.99 million for Supply business and 43.96 million for Distribution business with total financial impact of Rs. 54.95 million is requested as PYA.

Currently 7 officers and 2 assistant directors on acting charge base, along with supporting staff is working under TESCO MIRAD. In FY 2023-24 3, Managers and 2 Dy. Directors will also be hired in TESCO MIRAD. Since MIRAD has a dedicated office and in order to better rationalize the costs of MIRAD, separate costs for MIRAD are requested for FY 2023-24. These costs included pay & allowances, vehicle & maintenance, TA, Furniture and Fixtures, Office Rent, IT equipment, 40% MIRAD Allowance, POL, utility bills, two new Vehicles and software's as per requirements of CTBCM. These costs of MIRAD department have been bifurcated between supply and distribution business. Total costs for MIRAD expenses for the Supply business requested is Rs. 18.09 million for FY 2023-24 and Rs 72.37 million for Distribution business for FY 2023-24. Total MIRAD costs of Rs. 90.46 million is requested t for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment (Annexure-C1).

Repair & Maintenance:

For Repair & Maintenance expenses, TESCO has increment in its costs due to its old and over loaded system. To ensure un-interrupted power supply to its consumers, the maintenance work is increased exponentially. Moreover, cost of material is also increased due to inflationary pressure and due to volatile economic conditions and financial instability. This made pressure on the cash flows of TESCO and the cost run off has occurred.

There are other factors like repair & maintenance of high voltage transmission lines damaged due to floods, increase in 11kV feeders, added in the excess costs in repair and maintenance.

The total financial impact in PYA is for FY 2020-21 and FY 2021-22 is Rs. 6.84 million for Supply business and 90.76 million for Distribution business with total financial impact of Rs. 97.60 million is requested as PYA.

Rs. 4.69 million is requested under head of Repair & Maintenance for Supplier business for FY 2023-24, while Rs. 133.10 million is requested for Distribution business for FY 2023-24. A total of Rs. 137.79 million is requested for Repair and Maintenance expenses for the FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

Travelling Allowance:

Due to the system aging and excessive increase in the major overhauling of the system, excessive manpower is used for staying at far flung areas. Moreover, to train the existing manpower of TESCO, excessive training programs and courses were conducted which impacts in the excessive traveling and staying outstation of manpower. This have major impact in the TA bills, which is requested to be allowed. The impact While determining the Travelling Allowance costs the CPI General of Dec 2022 24.5% has been used reduced by X-Factor of 30% resulting in 17.15% net inflation for Travelling Allowance. Total cost under head Travelling Allowance Rs. 8.13 million is request for Supplier business for FY 2023-24, while Rs. 32.52 million is requested for Distribution business for FY 2023-24. A total of Rs. 40.65 million under head Travelling Allowance is requested for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

Vehicle Maintenance:

It is important to mention that TESCO operations area is spread over 27,219 Squared KM and has to maintain a fleet of vehicles in operations. Further there has been substantially increase in the POL costs due to which the CPI for fuel for Dec 2022 49.45% has been considered. Total costs under head Vehicle Maintenance of Rs. 11.43 million is requested for Supply business for FY 2023-24, while Rs. 45.72 million is requested for the Distribution business for FY 2023-24. A total Rs. 57.15 million is requested for vehicle maintenance and POL for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

Other Expenses

The other expenses of TESCO are all those costs, which has not been covered under any other head as discussed above. The major components of other costs are Injuries and Damages, Consultancy Fees, ERP Charges, Safety Consultant Fees, Legal Fees, Board of Directors Fees, Rent, Advertising Fees, Telephone, Computer services, Power Light and Water and others. While determining the other expenses costs the CPI General of Dec 2022 24.5% has been used reduced by X-Factor of 30% resulting in 17.15% net inflation for other expenses costs. Total costs under the head of other expenses of Rs. 28.57 million is requested for Supplier business for FY 2023-24, while Rs. 114.27 million is requested for Distribution business for FY 2023-24. A total of Rs. 142.84 million has been requested in other expenses for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustments.

Depreciation:

The depreciation has been calculated according to the criteria prescribe by NEPRA. Rs. 11.33 million is requested for Supply business for FY 2023-24, while Rs. 575.59 million is requested for Distribution business for FY 2023-24. A total of Rs. 587 million under head of depreciation is requested for FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment (Annexure-D1).

Other Income

Other income compromises of Rental and Service Income, Profit on deposits, Amortization of deferred credits, Miscellaneous income which is tabulated as below. A total of Rs. 778.777 million is requested for the Distribution business of FY 2023-24 as indexation/adjustment.

<u>RORB</u>

NEPRA while determination of TESCO's Distribution tariff has not allowed RORB to TESCO. As a historical fact TESCO is receiving grants from federal/provincial government. Still TESCO has some strategic projects, which requires to be covered through own resources. These projects include upgradation of 66kV grid stations meeting the N-1 contingency criteria of important TESCO grids, bifurcation, trifurcation of 11 kV circuits, replacement of overloaded transformers. Segregation of TESCO system from PESCO system as directed by NEPRA and decreasing cost of doing business, reduction in losses in the system. These projects are also necessary to cope with the upcoming industrial demand based on TESCO PMS study. The government funded projects are not necessarily meant for reduction in losses or to achieve the benchmark of NEPRA rather these are socio-political projects. In order to achieve all the NEPRA benchmarks and to upgrade the aging and overloaded system of TESCO, it is submitted to the Authority that TESCO may please be allowed Rs. 1021.39 million for FY 2020-21 and Rs. 1528.86 million for FY 2021-22 as PYA, which were previously deferred by the Authority.

Further TESCO is going to initiate projects in FY 2023-24 in the light of TSEP and investment plan already approved by NEPRA in MYT. It is therefore requested to allow RORB of Rs. 3246.16 for FY 2023-24. (Annexure-E1)

While working out the RORB, the RAB assets bases has been readjusted to the projected amount of FY 2023-24. At the same time 3 months KIBOR of Dec 30st 2022 (Annexure-E1.1) has been considered i.e. 17% and 2% spread as allowed by NEPRA has been added.

Wheeling Charges:

The Honorable Authority in its Tariff determination of Supply Tariff for FY 2019-20 of TESCO dated 14-12-2020 determination approved the wheeling charges (Use of System Charges) which is rewritten here as:

23. Wheeling Charges


23.1. The Petitioner in its instant petition has requested an amount of Rs.2,550 million on account of wheeling charges. However, no further working/ supportive evidence and justification has been provided by the Petitioner.

23.2. The Petitioner is using both 11kV and 132 kV transmission lines of PESCO, consequently the Wheeling charges payable to PESCO are calculated according to the use of system charges given in the tariff determination of PESCO for the FY 2019-20.

Based on the above discussion, NEPRA is requested to allow under the head of wheeling charges as Rs 595.09 million for FY 2020-21 and Rs. 570.442 million for FY 2021-22 as part of PYA.

For FY 2023-24 Rs. 665.981 million is requested to be allowed for FY 2023-24 as part of indexation/adjustment.

PYA

The components of PYA has already been discussed in the preceding paragraphs. Further CPPA-G charges supplemental charges to TESCO (Annexure-G1.2), Input Tax Charges to TESCO (Annexure-G1.1), and PHPL Markup to TESCO (Annexure-G1.3). As Sales Tax on electricity supplied within EX-FATA has been declared as exempt by federal government, TESCO cannot claim input tax adjustment on the electricity sold, resulting in loss to TESCO.

As above ongoing discussion, some components which are not discussed in the preceding sections, are also included in the PYA. Total PYA of Supply business for FY 2020-21 Rs. 3529.96 is requested and for FY 2021-22 Rs. 6256.06 million is requested. For the Distribution business, total PYA for FY 2020-21 Rs.1541.62 million is requested and Rs. 2257.54 million for FY 2021-22 is requested (Annexure £1).

REVISION OF BASIC PAY SCALES & ALLOWANCES OF CIVIL SERVANTS OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT (2022)

The President has been pleased to sanction the revision of Basic Pay Scales & Allowances with effect from 1st July, 2022 for the civil employees of the Federal Government, paid out of civil estimates and from the Defence estimates as detailed in the following paragraphs:

Part-I (Pay)

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i)

The Basic Pay Scales-2022 shall replace the Basic Pay Scales-2017 with effect from 01-07-2022 as contained in the Annexure-I to this Office Memorandum.

Fixation of Pay of the existing employees:

Revision of Basic Pay Scales:

- The basic pay of an employee in service on 30-06-2022 shall be fixed in the Basic Pay Scales-2022 on point to point basis i.e. at the stage corresponding to that occupied by him/her above the minimum of Basic Pay Scales-2017;
- In case of Personal Pay being drawn by an employee as part of his/her basic pay beyond the maximum of his/her pay scale on 30-06-2022, he/she shall continue to draw such pay in the Basic Pay Scales-2022 at the revised rates.

Fixation of Pay on promotion:

In cases of promotion from a lower to higher posts/scale before introduction of these scales, the pay of the employees concerned in the revised pay scale may be fixed and so enhanced that it would not be less than the pay that would have been admissible to him if his promotion to the higher post/scale had taken place after the introduction of these scales.

5. <u>Annual increment:</u>

Annual increment shall continue to be admissible, subject to the existing conditions, on 1st December each year.

Ad-hoc Relief Allowance-2022:

a) An Ad-hoc Relief Allowance-2022 @ 15% of the running basic pay of BPS-2017 shall be allowed to the civil employees of the Federal Government as well as civilians paid out of Defence estimates including contingent paid staff and contract employees employed against civil posts in Basic Pay Scales on standard terms and conditions of contract appointment with effect from 01-07-2022 and shall stand frozen at the same level till further orders;

- All the new entrants shall be allowed Ad-hoc Relief Allowance-2022
 @ 15% of the Minimum of the relevant basic pay of BPS-2017 on notional basis with effect from 01-07-2022 till further orders and shall stand frozen at the same level;
- c) The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will be subject to Income Tax;
- d) The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will be admissible during leave and entire period of L.P.R. except during extra ordinary leave;
- e) The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will not be treated as part of emoluments for the purpose of calculation of Pension/Gratuity and recovery of House Rent;
- f) The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will not be admissible to the employees during the tenure of their posting/deputation abroad;
- g) The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will be admissible to the employees on their repatriation from posting/deputation abroad at the rate and amount which would have been admissible to them, had they not been posted abroad;

- The Ad-hoc Relief Allowance will be admissible during the period of suspension;
- i) The term "Basic Pay" will also include the amount of Personal Pay granted on account of annual increment(s) beyond the maximum of the existing pay scales.

Special Pay and Allowances:

All the Special Pays, Special Allowances or the Allowances admissible as percentage of pay (excluding those which are capped by fixing maximum limit) including House Rent Allowance and the Allowance/Special Allowance equal to one month basic pay, granted to Federal Government employees irrespective of his/her posting in Ministry/Division/Department/Office etc. including civil employees in BPS 1-22 of Judiciary shall stand frozen at the level of its admissibility as on 30-06-2022.

- 9. <u>Option:</u>
 - (1) The Ministry/Division/Department/Office to which an employee belongs and/or on whose pay roll he/she is borne shall obtain an option in writing from such employees within <u>30 days</u> commencing from the date of issue of this Office Memorandum and communicate it to the concerned Accounts Office/DDO, as the case may be, either to continue to draw salary in the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales-2017 or in the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales-2022 as specified in this Office Memorandum. Option once exercised shall be considered final;
 - (2) An existing employee, as aforesaid, who does not exercise and communicate his/her option within the specified time limit, shall be deemed to have opted for the Scheme of Basic Pay Scales-2022.

10. All the existing rules/orders on the subject shall be considered to have been modified to the extent indicated above. All the existing rules/orders, not so modified, shall continue to be in force under this scheme.

11. <u>Anomalies</u>:

An Anomaly Committee shall be set up in the Finance Division (Regulations Wing) to resolve the anomalies, if any, arising out in the implementation of the Basic Pay Scales-2022.

Subject: - GRANT OF INCREASE IN PENSION TO PENSIONERS OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

The undersigned is directed to state that the Federal Government has been pleased to enhance the existing rate of increase in pension (i.e. 10% granted w.e.f 01.04.2022 vide O.M. of even number dated 14th & 30th April, 2022) to 15% w.e.f. 01.07.2022 to all pensioners of the Federal Government including Civilians paid from Defence Estimates as well as retired Armed Forces' personnel and Civil Armed Forces' personnel, until further orders. This increase in pension @ 15% will also be admissible to those pensioners who will retire on or after 01.07.2022.

2. The previous five (05) increases in pension will cease to exist for the pensioners who will retire on or after 1st July, 2022 i.e. (@ 10% of 2016, @ 10% of 2017, @ 10% of 2018, @ 10% of 2019 and @ 10% of 2021).

3. Other conditions (vide paras 2-6 of O.M. of even number dated 14.04.2022) will remain the same.

Inflation in Brief

- 1. CPI inflation General. increased to 24.5% on year-on-year basis in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 23.8% in the previous month and 12.3% in Dec 2021. On month-on-month basis, it increased to 0.5% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 0.8% in the previous month and with no change in Dec 2021.
- 2. CPI inflation Urban, increased to 21.6% on year-on-year basis in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 21.6% in the previous month and 12.7% in Dec 2021. On month-on-month basis, it increased to 0.3% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 0.4% in the previous month and an increase of 0.3% in Dec 2021.
- 3. CPI inflation Rural, increased to 28.8% on year-on-year basis in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 27.2% in the previous month and 11.6% in Dec 2021. On month-on-month basis, it increased to 0.7% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 1.3% in the previous month and a decrease of 0.5% in Dec 2021.
- **4.** SPI inflation on YoY increased to 27.8% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 27.1% a month earlier and an increase of 20.9% in Dec 2021. On MoM basis, it increased by 0.2% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 6.1% a month earlier and a decrease of 0.4% in Dec 2021.
- 5. WPI inflation on YoY basis increased to 27.1% in Dec 2022 as compared to an increase of 27.7% a month earlier and an increase of 26.2% in Dec 2021. On MoM basis, it decreased by 0.7% in Dec 2022 with no change a month earlier and a decrease of 0.2% in corresponding month i.e. Dec 2021.
- **6.** Figures 1 and 2 show graphically the yearly data of Table 1.a for Urban and Rural CPI while Table 1.1 shows "Period Average" and "YoY" percent changes in indices of three years.

V. Wholesale Price Index

Inc wholesale Price Index for December, 2022 decreased by 0.71% over November, 2022. It increased to 27.11% over the corresponding month of the last year i.e. Dec, 2021. YoY and MoM movements, from December, 2021 to December, 2022 are also graphed below in Figure 8.



1 STATUS AND ACTIVITIES

- 1.1 Tribal Areas Electric Supply Company Limited (the Company) was incorporated on July 03, 2002 as a public limited Company under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 having its registered office situated WAPDA House Lahore in the province of Punjab. The Company was formed to acquire/takeover all the properties, rights, assets, obligations and liabilities relating to Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) from Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA) and such other assets and liabilities as agreed. All such assets and liabilities have been transferred to the Company under the terms and conditions of Business Transfer Agreement dated July 31, 2004 which is effective from July 01, 2003. The Company has received distribution license in 2012-13.
- 1.2 The Company is a wholly owned subsidairy of Water and Power Development Authority (WAPDA).
- 1.3 The Company has accumulated losses of Rs.17,528 million (2020: Rs.22,538 million) as at the year end. Current liabilities of the Company have exceeded its current assets by Rs.5807 million (2020: 9122 million) as at balance sheet date. The distribution losses of the Company are 9.6% (2020: 16.2%) of the electricity purchased. These factors indicate the existence of a material uncertainty, which may cast significant doubts on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern and the Company may not be able to realize its assets and discharge its liabilities in the normal course of business.

The Company has taken different measures and has succeeded in reduction of its distribution losses. As a result, the Company is earning profit for the last 6 years. Moreover, the Company is a public interest company and is backed by Government of Pakistan. The Government of Pakistan is providing subsidy to the Company to cover up its losses and will provide the financial support to the Company as and when required. Considering these factors, the management is confident that the Company will be able to continue as a going concern.

2 Statement of compliance

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These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan. The accounting and reporting standards applicable in Pakistan comprise of:

- International Financial Reporting Standard (IFRS's) issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) as notified under the Companies Act, 2017; and
- Provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017.

Where provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 differ from the IFRS's, the provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Act, 2017 have been followed.

2.1 Application of new and revised International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs)

2.1.1 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in current year

The following standards, amendments to standards and interpretations have been effective and are mandatory for financial statements of the Company for the periods beginning on or after July 01,2017 and therefore, have been applied in preparing these financial statements.

IAS 12 Income taxes

The amendments to IAS 12 address the issue of recognition of deferred tax assets for unrealized losses and clarify how to account for deferred tax assets related to debt instruments measured at fair value.

The application of these amendments has no impact on the Company's financial statements.

IAS 7 Statement of cash flows

The amendments to IAS 7 introduce an additional disclosure that will enable users of financial statements to evaluate changes in liabilities arising from financing activities.

The application of these amendments has no impact on the Company's financial statements.

2.1.4 Standards, amendments to standards and interpretations becoming effective in future period but not relevant.

3 Basis of preparation

- 3.1 These financial statements have been prepared on the basis of the historical cost convention.
- 3.2 These Financial statements are presented in pakistani Rupees, which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

4 Significant accounting estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IASs / IFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised.

Significant areas requiring the use of management estimates in these financial statements relate to the useful life of depreciable assets, provision for doubtful receivables and amortisation of deferred credits. However, assumptions and judgments made by management in the application of accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements are not expected to result in material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the next year.

5 Summary of significant accounting policies

The significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years for which financial information is presented in these financial statements, unless otherwise stated.

5.1 Borrowings costs

Borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets, which are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use or sale, are added to the cost of those assets, until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale. All other borrowing costs are charged to profit and loss account whenever incurred.

5.2 Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment, except freehold land and capital work in progress, are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. Cost comprises acquisition and other directly attributable costs. Freehold land and capital work in progress are stated at cost less impairment losses, if any. Capital work in

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self- constructed assets includes the cost of materials, direct labor and any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use.

Depreciation is provided on straight line method and charged to profit or loss to write off the depreciable amount of each asset over its estimated useful life at the rates specified in note 6.1. Depreciation on addition in property, plant and equipment is charged from the month of purchase or capitalization upto the month preceeding the month of its disposal.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefit associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. Minor repair and maintenance are charged to income and expenditure account as and when incurred.

Repair and maintenance expenditure on capital works in progress are charged to profit and loss account as and when incurred while major renewals and improvements are capitalized.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of property, plant and equipment, and are recognized in profit or

5.3 Stores, spares and loose tools

Stores, spares and loose tools are valued at cost, determined on moving average method less allowance for obsolete and slow moving items, Items in transit are valued at invoice value plus other charges incurred thereon.

Stocks, except wastes, are valued at lower of cost and net realizable value using the moving average method. Items in transit are valued at comprising invoice value and other charges incurred thereon.

5.4 Trade debts

Trade debts are carried at original billed value less an estimate for provision for doubtful debts. Trade debts are written-off when considered irrecoverable. No provision is made on government arrears and provision for receivable other than from Government is calculated in accordance with the policy approved by Board of Directors.

5.5 Loans and other receivables

These are initially recognized at the fair value of consideration given. Subsequent to initial recognition these are recorded at their amortized cost less impairment, if any.

5.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are carried at cost. For the purpose of cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, balances with banks in current and savings accounts, and short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash, and subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

5.7 Staff retirement benefits

The Company also maintains a General Provident Fund and WAPDA Welfare Fund for all its regular employees. The Company makes deductions from salaries of its employees and remits these amounts to the respective funds established by WAPDA.

5.8 Deferred credit

As the Company has applied IFRIC 18, as a result of which amounts received from consumers and the Government as contributions towards the cost of extension of distribution network and of providing service connections are deferred for amortization over the estimated useful lives of related assets except for separately identifiable services in which case revenue is recognized upfront upon establishing a connection network. The rate of amortization is 3.5%.

5.10 Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are recognized initially at fair value plus directly attributable cost, if any, and subsequently carried at amortized cost, which approximates the fair value of the consideration to be paid in future for goods and services received, whether or not billed to the Company.

5.11 Revenue recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent it is probable that the future economic benefits will flow to the Company. The Company generates revenue from:

a) Electricity sale

Revenue related to electricity sales is recognized on supply of electricity to consumers at the rates determined by NEPRA and notified by the Government of Pakistan, from time to time. Late payment surcharges are recognized on an accrual basis.

b) Tariff differential subsidy

Tariff differential subsidy on electricity announced by the Government of Pakistan for consumers is recognized under revenue on an accrual basis.

c) Rental and service income

Meter rentals are recognized on a time proportionate basis.

d) Interest / mark-up

Interest / mark-up on bank deposits is recognized on accrual basis using the effective interest rate method.

5.12 Borrowings

Borrowings are recognized initially at cost, less attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, borrowings are stated at original cost less subsequent repayments, while the difference between the original recognized amounts (as reduced by periodic payments) and the redemption value is recognized in the profit and loss account over the period of borrowing on an effective rate basis. The borrowing cost on qualifying assets is included in the cost of the related assets.

5.13 Provisions

A provision is recognized in the balance sheet when the Company has a legal or constructive obligation as a result of a past event, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of obligation. Provisions are measured at the present value of expected expenditure, discounted at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessment of the time value of the money and the risk specific to the obligation. However, provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect current best estimates.

5.14 Provision for taxation

a) Current

Provision for current tax is based on taxable income for the year determined in accordance with the prevailing law for taxation of income. The charge for current tax is calculated using prevailing current tax rates or tax rates after taking into account rebates and tax credits, if any, expected to apply to the profit for the year, if enacted. The charge for current tax also includes adjustments, where considered necessary, to provision for tax made in previous years arising from assessments framed during the year for such years.

b) Deferred

Deferred tax is accounted for ail timing differences between carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and their tax base. Deferred tax liabilities are recognized for all taxable temporary differences. The Company recognizes deferred tax assets on all deductible temporary differences to the extent it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which these deductible temporary differences can be utilized. Deferred tax asset is also recognized for the carry forward of unused tax losses and unused tax credits to the extent it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the unused tax losses and unused tax credits can be utilized. Deferred tax is charged to/credited in the profit and loss account except in case of items credited or charged to equity in which case it is included in equity.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realized or the liability is settled, based on the tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Income tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in profit and loss account except to extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

5.15 Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognized when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument, and de-recognized when the Company loses control of the contractual rights that comprise the financial assets, and in case of financial liabilities, when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires. All financial assets and liabilities are initially recognized at fair value plus transaction costs other than financial assets and liabilities carried at fair value through profit or loss. Financial assets and liabilities carried at fair value through profit or loss are initially recognized at fair value, and transaction costs are charged to income for the year. These are subsequently measured at fair value, amortized cost or cost, as the case may be. Any gain or losses on de-recognition of financial assets and financial liabilities are included in profit and loss

a) Financial assets

Classification and subsequent measurement:

The Company classifies its financial assets in the following categories: fair value through profit or loss, held-tomaturity investments, loans and receivables and available-for-sale financial assets. The classification depends on the purpose for which the financial assets were acquired. Management determines the classification of its financial assets at initial recognition. Regular purchases and sales of financial assets are recognized on the trade date - the date on which the Company commits to purchase or sell the asset.

i Fair value through profit or loss

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss include financial assets held-for-trading and financial assets, designated upon initial recognition, at fair value through profit or loss.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss are carried in the financial statements at their fair values, with changes therein recognized in the income for the year. Assets in this category are classified as current assets.

ii Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. After initial measurement, these financial assets are measured at amortized cost, using the effective interest rate method, less impairment, if any.

Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses at the, end of each balance sheet date whether there is objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired as a result of one or more events that occurred after the initial recognition of the asset (a 'loss event') and that loss event (or events) has an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset or group of financial assets that can be reliably estimated.

a) Financial liabilities

Initial recognition and measurement

The Company classifies its financial liabilities in the following categories: fair value through profit or loss and other financial liabilities. The Company determines the classification of its financial liabilities at initial recognition.

All financial liabilities are recognized initially at fair value and, in the case of other financial liabilities, also include directly attributable transaction costs.

Subsequent measurement

The measurement of financial liabilities depends on their classification as follows:

i) Fair value through profit or loss

Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss include financial liabilities held-for-trading and financial liabilities designated upon initial recognition as being at fair value through profit or loss. The Company has not designated any financial liabilities upon initial recognition as being at fair value through profit or loss.

ii Other financial liabilities

After initial recognition, other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortized cost, using the effective interest rate method.

c) Offsetting of financial assets and financial liabilities

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the financial statements, if the Company has a legally enforceable right to set-off the recognized amounts, and the Company either intends to settle on a net basis, or realize the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

5.16 Off-setting of financial assets and financial liabilities

Financial assets and liabilities are off set and the net amount is reported in the financial statements only when there is a legally enforceable right to set-off the recognized amount and the Company intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realize the assets and to settle the liabilities simultaneously.

5.17 Transactions with related parties

Transactions with related parties are carried out at arm's length. The prices are determined in accordance with comparable uncontrolled price method. The power is sold to related parties at the rates determined by National Electric Power Regulatory Authority.

5.18 Critical accounting estimates and judgments

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IASs / IFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised.

Significant areas requiring the use of management estimates in these financial statements relate to the useful life of depreciable assets, provision for doubtful receivables and slow moving inventory and staff retirement gratuity. However, assumptions and judgments made by management in the application of accounting policies that have significant effect on the financial statements are not expected to result in material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the next year.
