PIMS' CHILDREN EMERGENCY RESPONSE CENTRE GETS AN UPLIFT Staff Reporter

ISLAMABAD: Children's Emergency Response Centre at the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (Pims) has been renovated and the area expanded to 5,000 square feet, raising the capacity of beds from 12 to 30. Talking to mediapersons who were especially invited to the centre, the hospital's director, Dr Khalid Masood, said the facility was renovated under publicprivate partnership (PPP) initiative. "The emergency response area has been expanded with the cooperation of the Child Life Foundation (CLF) which has replicated its emergency care model in Islamabad," he said. Speaking on the occasion, CLF General Manager Communications Shahzad Zaki said the foundation had been providing free emergency care and consultation to children across Sindh, Balochistan and Punjab for the last 11 years.

"This year we have achieved a milestone by modernising the children emergency response (ER) centre at Pims. The impact of this ER will be huge as it will serve underprivileged children not only in the capital territory and Punjab but also from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Gilgit-Baltistan," he said. Mr Zaki said the CLF had so far saved 4.5 million children absolutely free of cost through its 12 state-of-the-art children's emergency rooms in Sindh, Balochistan and Punjab.
