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DECISION

1. As per facts of the case, the Respondent is an agricultural consumer of the MEPCO having connection bearing Ref No.29-15718-1184800-R with a sanctioned load of 22 kW and the applicable tariff category is D-2(b). The Respondent challenged the detection bill of Rs.330,774/- for 33,288 units for the period May 2018 to October 2018 and the estimated bills for December 2018 to February 2019 before the Provincial Office of Inspection, Multan Region, Multan (hereinafter referred to as 'the POI'). The complaint of the

Respondent was decided by the POI vide decision dated 22.10.2019, wherein the above-

disputed bills were cancelled and the MEPCO was allowed to charge the revised bills for

September 2018 and October 2018 on DEF-EST code, and the bill for the cost of 385

units for the period 01.12.2018 to 12.12.2018 i.e. date of replacement of the defective

meter.

2. Subject appeal has been filed against the afore-referred decision by the MEPCO before

the NEPRA. After issuing notices to the parties, hearing of the appeal was held at the

NEPRA Regional Office, Multan on 21.03.2022, which was attended by learned counsel

along with SDO MEPCO for the Appellant and no one appeared for the Respondent. At

the outset of the hearing, learned counsel for the MEPCO averred that the dispute of

billing has been resolved between the parties, as such the MEPCO did not intend to

proceed further with the appeal. In this regard, the MEPCO submitted an application for

withdrawal of the appeal.

3. Forgoing in view, the appeal is disposed of as withdrawn.
