SUBJECT: COMPLAINT FILED BY MR. RAHEEM DAD KHAN UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE REGULATION OF GENERATION, TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF ELECTRIC POWER ACT, 1997 AGAINST FESCO REGARDING DETECTION BILL (REF # 09-13152-0811300).

DECISION

This decision shall dispose of the complaint filed by Mr. Raheem dad Khan (hereinafter referred to as the "Complainant") against Faisalabad Electric Supply Company (hereinafter referred to as the "FESCO") under Section 39 of the Regulation of Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Electric Power Act, 1997 (hereinafter referred to as the "NEPRA Act").

- 2. NEPRA received a complaint from the Complainant wherein it was submitted that a detection bill was charged by FESCO during the month of July, 2024 against his residential premises with mala fide intentions. The matter was taken up with FESCO whereby FESCO vide a letter dated August 20, 2024 submitted that Complainant was found involved in their vide a letter dated August 20, 2024 submitted that Complainant was found involved in their of electrify through main PVC cable and accordingly, a detection bill of (3942) units for the period of (6) months was charged to the Complainant along with registration of FIR against the Complainant based on the direct theft. In order to analyze matter, a hearing was held on September 12, 2024 at NEPRA Regional Office, Faisalabad and the matter was discussed in detail.
- 3. The case has been examined in detail in light of record made so available by parties, arguments advanced during the hearing and applicable law. Following has been observed:
 - The Complainant's residential connection installed against reference number (09-13152-0811300) located at Chak No. 124 RB, Chota Behlol Pur, District Faisalabad was charged a detection bill of (3942) units by FESCO during the month of July, 2024 on account of the direct theft of electricity from main PVC cable of which FIR has also been registered against the Complainant. The dispute raised by the Complainant was that the exorbitant detection bill inconsiderate of the connected load has been charged by FESCO.

- Perusal of the documentary evidence reveals the Complainant was charged detection ii. bill for the period of six months i.e. December, 2023 to May, 2024 on the basis of connected load i.e. (5) kW which is consistent with the clause 9.1.3 of the Consumer Service Manual (CSM) for charging detection bill in case of direct theft of electricity by a registered consumer i.e. the Complainant as per which the corresponding detection shall be charged on the basis of running load for the maximum period of six months.
- During the hearing, the Complainant acceded to the alleged theft of electricity, hence, iii. the reliance can be made on the statement of the Complainant for a concrete proof of theft which then requires none further analysis on act of theft of electricity committed cannot by the Complainant. However, keeping in line with the clause 9.1.3 of CSM and after considering contentions of the Complainant regarding of quantum of the detection bill in conjunction with the careful perusal of consumption history i.e. 40% less than prior year consumption of the Complainant, it is concluded that the detection bill charged 11 to the Complainant is on the higher side and required to be revised by factoring in the sanctioned load i.e. (3) kW instead of the assessed load as per which (2190) units are to be charged instead of (3942) units after adjusting the actual consumption recorded during the detection period which was agreed by the FESCO official and upon which the Complainant showed satisfaction.
