DECISION IN THE MATTER OF COMPLAINT FILED BY MST. FARIDA BANO UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE REGULATION OF GENERATION, TRANSMISSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF ELECTRIC POWER ACT, 1997 AGAINST K-ELECTRIC LIMITED REGARDING OVER BILLING (CONSUMER NO. AP-070710)

This decision shall dispose of the Complaint filed by Mst. Farida Bano, 463, PIB Colony, Karachi, (hereinafter referred to as "the Complainant" against K-Electric Limited (KE) (hereinafter referred to as the "Respondent" or "KE", under Section 39 of the Regulation of Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Electric Power Act, 1997 (hereinafter referred to as the "NEPRA Act").

- Brief facts of the case are that NEPRA received the compliant wherein the Complainant 2. submitted that KE has charged fix/minimum charges against the connection bearing consumer No. AP-070710 and dues have been accumulated since the year 2013. The Complainant informed that the premises was disconnected and was vacant; thus there was no use of electricity. Further the Complainant informed that an amount of Rs. 20,000/- was paid as final outstanding dues for permanent disconnection and stoppage of billing but KE did not stop billing. In response, KE submitted that the applicable fixed charges are billed based on 50% of sanctioned load or actual MDI whichever is higher as per the approved tariff terms & conditions.
- The matter was taken-up with KE for submission of para wise comments/report. In response, KE 3. vide letter dated April 16, 2023 reported that applicable fixed charges are required to be billed based on 50% of sanctioned load or actual MDI whichever is higher as per S.R.O 1175(1)/2022 dated July 2022. Accordingly, fixed charges billed to Complainant since the month of August 2022 are as per the aforesaid S.R.O.

- To proceed further into the matter, a hearing was held at NEPRA Regional office Karachi on April 4. 13, 2023 which was attended by the Complainant in person and representative of KE via video link. KE was directed vide letter dated April 17, 2023. It is observed that premises is disconnected since long. In view of the discussion, please direct the concerned officials to stop billing since March 2023 on the disconnected connection till finalization of the matter by NEPRA. In response, KE vide letter dated April 27, 2023 submitted that in compliance with the contents of NEPRA letter the connection in question was inactivated on April 15, 2023, until finalization of the case by NEPRA. Accordingly, another hearing was held on May 30, 2023 & November 28, 2023 at NEPRA Regional office Karachi which was attended by the Complainant in person and representative of KE via video link wherein the matter was discussed in detail.
- The case has been examined in detail in light of the record made so available by the parties, arguments 5. advanced during the hearing and applicable 1aw. The following has been concluded:
 - The instant matter pertains to charging of the applicable fixed charges are billed based on 50% **(i)** of sanctioned load or actual MDI is higher as per the approved tariff terms & conditions. KE has charged fix charges on the Complainant connection having consumer No. AP-070710 and dues were accumulated since 2013.
 - The Complainant informed that the premises was disconnected and was vacant; thus there (ii) was no use of electricity.
 - Further the Complainant informed that an amount of Rs. 20,000/- was paid as final (iii) outstanding dues for permanent disconnection and stoppage of billing but KE did not stop billing.
 - The consumer paid Rs, 20, 000/- in November 2016 for connection however KE failed to (iv) stop billing and issued bills on minimum mode on disconnected premises till April 2023. The said bills charged by KE for the period from January 2017 till April 2023 are unjustified and the same are required to be withdrawn.
- Foregoing in view, KE is directed to withdraw the billing charged to the Complainant from January 6. 2017 till April 2023, overhaul the account accordingly and dismantle account in billing record. A report in this regard be submitted within twenty (20) days, positively.
