SUBJECT: DECISION IN THE MATTER OF COMPLAINT FILED BY MR. MUHAMMAD BILAL S/O MUKHTAR AHMAD W.R.T. ORDER OF HONORABLE LAHORE HIGH COURT, LAHORE DATED NOVEMBER 15, 2024 IN WRIT PETITION NO. 70928-2024 (A/C# 04 11735 0835509).

DECISION

This decision shall dispose of the complaint filed by Mr. Muhammad Bilal S/o Mukhtar Ahmad (hereinafter referred to as the "Complainant") against Lahore Electricity Supply Company (hereinafter referred to as the "Respondent" or "LESCO"), under Section 39 of the Regulation of Generation, Transmission and Distribution of Electric Power Act, 1997 (hereinafter referred to as the "NEPRA Act").

2. NEPRA received order of the Honorable Lahore High Court Lahore dated November 13, 2024, in Writ Peition No. 70928/2024 regarding the complaint of Mr. Muhammad Bilal with the directions to dispose of the matter strictly in accordance with law within fifteen (15) days. Accordingly, the matter was taken up with LESCO and a hearing was held on December 17, 2024 in MEPRA Head Office, Islamabad which was attended by both the parties i.e. LESCO in person and the Complainant online, wherein the matter was discussed in details. During the nearing LESCO submitted that the Complainant's connection was charged with three (3) different detection bills as tabulated below.

CRC Decision: Muna:nmad Bilal vs LESCO (LESCO-NHQ-47822-12-24)

- The dispute raised by the Complainant was that the detection bills have been charged by LESCO with the mala fide intent in the absence of any evidence.
- The case has been examined in detail in light of the record made so available by parties, arguments advanced during the hearing and applicable law. Following has been observed:
 - The Complainant's electricity connection was installed on August 20, 2020 against reference number (04 11735 0835509) and was charged 3 x detection bills in the months of August 2021, April, 2022, June 2022, amounting to Rs. 16,085/- (557 units), Rs. 11,355/- (374 units) and Rs. 24,749/- (722 units) respectively for a period of three months.
 - ii. The Complainant was charged detection bills on the basis of alleged theft of electricity, clause 9.1.4 of CSM provides that the DISCO shall take photos and/or record video and exhibit before a competent forum as evidence of theft of electricity. however, LESCO failed to produce any such evidence to establish theft of electricity by the Complainant.
 - Clause 6.1.4 of CSM provides that "Meter Readers shall also check the iii. irregularities/discrepancies in the metering system at the time of reading meters / taking snap shots and report the same in the reading book/discrepancy book or through any other appropriate method as per the practice. The concerned officer/official will take corrective action to rectify these discrepancies". However, no such discrepancies was reported earlier.
- Foregoing in view, the detection bills have been charged without any evidence as required under the provisions of CSM. In view of the said, LESCO is directed to withdraw the detection bills charged in the months of August 2021, April, 2022, June 2022, amounting to Rs. 16,085/- (557 units), Rs. 11,355/- (374 units) and Rs. 24,749/- (722 units). A report in this regard be submitted within twenty (20) days, positively.
